Aptucxet Garden Club receives prestigious awards at National Garden Club's "Eureka" Flower Show at Heritage Museums and Gardens

At the close of the National Garden Club's "Eureka!" Flower Show on July 21 at Heritage Museums and Gardens in Sandwich, prestigious awards were announced. Members of Aptucxet Garden Club of Bourne received many important awards.

Alda Barron of Pocasset was awarded a first-place blue ribbon in the Class "Barbie" as well as the Botanical Arts Award for the finest Botanical Arts exhibit in the Show. She creatively "dressed" a 12" high Barbie mannequin in an evening gown and jewels made from plant material including andromeda flowers, baby's breath, carnation, chia seeds, maiden grass, papaya seed and rose petals. Alda also received a blue-ribbon level award for her "Piano" design and the Horticulture Collector's Showcase Award for her pristine group of varied hosta leaves.

Isabel Melo received a blue-ribbon level award for her artistic hair comb decorated with straw flowers, cypress and lily-of-the-valley shrub.

Karen Cronburg of Cataumet received first place and the Horticulture Award of Merit for her Zinnia. Additional awards in Design and Horticulture were received by Darlene Chickosky, Paula O'Neil of Bourne, Julie Arnold, Bobbie Dwyer of Gray Gables and Sally Baer, Laura Bergeron, Mary Doo and Judy Sheehy of Sagamore Beach.

In the Youth Division, Alda Barron's granddaughter Everly age 3 exhibited a decorated butterfly made of plant material and Marcia Willmott of Bourne's granddaughter Aubrey age 5 entered a decorated butterfly and a teacup design that received the Junior Achievement Award!

The flower show was presented by the Garden Club Federation of MA Southeastern District Clubs. The "Eureka!" titles such as Rubber, Corkscrew, Piano, and Disco Ball inspired 44 creative floral designs, horticulture by adults and designs by children aged from under 7 and 7-12.

The Town of Bourne is partnering with the Aptucxet Garden Club and the Cape Cod Canal Chamber of Commerce to beautify and install planters along Main Street and Town Hall.

Members of Aptucxet Garden Club have donated plants and volunteer services to the Town's Facilities and Public Works teams to make cosmetic improvements to ten existing planters along Main Street in Buzzards Bay.

Additionally, the Cape Cod Canal Region Chamber of Commerce aided in the purchase of flowers for four new self-watering, double walled sub-irrigation planters as part of a new pilot program, to be installed at the Main Street entrance of Buzzards Bay Park and the entrance to Town Hall.

Interesting Plant Facts:



Carolina All Spice, calycanthus floridus

Calycanthus floridus is commonly known as **Carolina all spice, eastern sweet shrub** or **spicebush**. It is identifiable by its dark red flowers and fragrant scent.

The shrub grows to be around 6 to 9 ft tall. Its leaves are a dark green with a pale underside. The flowers are solitary, featuring a reddish brown to reddish purple color when they bloom in spring. They are aromatic and so are the leaves when bruised.

The shrub is native to the eastern United States. It prefers sunny habitats but can tolerate moderate amounts of shade. It grows well in environments that feature moist substrate. It is very resistive to disease and insects. The bark of the plant is edible and is reportedly used as a substitute for cinnamon.
